LEGENDARY JAPANESE ACTOR TATSUYA NAKADAI APPEARS WITH THE 1966 SAMURAI CLASSIC 'THE SWORD OF DOOM'

Saturday, November 5, 2016, at 3:30 p.m.

Astoria, New York, October 28, 2016—Tatsuya Nakadai (b. 1932) is one of the greatest actors in the history of cinema, starring in more than 130 movies, by directors including Akira Kurosawa, Masaki Kobayashi, Kon Ichikawa, and Mikio Naruse. In what has become a popular annual program, Museum of the Moving Image is pleased to announce **An Afternoon with Tatsuya Nakadai**, co-presented with **The Japan Foundation**, on Saturday, November 5, at 3:30 p.m. Nakadai will participate in a discussion following a screening of the **The Sword of Doom**, Kihachi Okamoto's 1966 samurai classic which costars Toshiro Mifune—marking the film's 50th anniversary—presented in a 35mm print imported from Japan.

In *The Sword of Doom,* Nakadai plays a gifted swordsman who kills without remorse or mercy, a way of life that ultimately leads to madness. This thrilling drama about a man who chooses to devote his life to evil is one of Nakadai's greatest performances, and his character stands in sharp contrast to that of Toshiro Mifune who appears in a minor, but memorable, role as a rival master swordsman (and a paragon of virtue). "[Nakadai] is one of the screen's more memorable psychopaths, a passive-aggressive whose bloodlust is portrayed with dead calm, revealed by the tiniest motion of an eye, the trace of a smile, or the tense position of his body as he ponders killing," wrote critic Bruce Eder.

This program marks the fourth visit to the Museum by Tatsuya Nakadai. Previously he appeared in 2013 with Akira Kurosawa's *Ran*, in 2014 with Hiroshi Teshighara's *Face of Another*, and in 2015 with screenings of *The Human Condition* and *Harakiri*, presented as part of a retrospective of films he made with Masaki Kobayashi.
