This darkly comic and insinuatingly hypnotic film comprises the extraordinary debut from Yorgos Lanthimos, whose first three films (*Kinetta, Dogtooth, The Alps*) defined the Greek New Wave before he shifted to English-language films, including Academy Award nominees *The Lobster* and *The Favourite*.
