SUMMER KIDS MATINEES TO FEATURE BIG-SCREEN SHOWINGS OF 'FANTASTIC MR. FOX,' 'TOY STORY' (3-D), AND 'ZOOTOPIA'

July 13-August 20, 2016

Astoria, Queens, New York, June 29, 2016—This summer, for the first time ever, Museum of the Moving Image will present near daily matinee screenings of family-friendly films, including *Fantastic Mr. Fox* (July 13–24), *Toy Story* in 3-D (July 27–August 7), and *Zootopia* (August 10–20). A screening ticket is included with general Museum admission (\$15 adults / \$11 seniors & students / \$7 youth ages 3–16) which also gives access to *Arcade Classics*, the current popular exhibition of more than 30 playable video arcade games. (Tickets for just the film are also available: \$12 adults / \$9 seniors and students / \$7 youth ages 3–16).
