WINTER RECESS FAMILY FUN AT MOMI WITH MUPPETS, MIYAZAKI, AND MEDIA-MAKING ACTIVITIES

Open daily December 22 through January 1, except for Christmas Day (Please note early closings on December 24 and 31)

Astoria, Queens, New York, December 4, 2018—This winter recess, from December 22, 2018 through January 1, 2019, Museum of the Moving Image will present daily matinee screenings of *A Muppet Family Christmas* and More, the 1987 Jim Henson holiday TV special presented with a short compilation of additional Henson holiday moments. The screening will be accompanied by drop-in activities including art making and animation around winter-themed special effects, puppet-making, and more. The Museum will also present three big-screen showings of *Howl's Moving Castle*, the Hayao Miyazaki—directed animated feature in which a young woman and a wizard set out to undo a curse with the help of enchanted creatures and a walking castle. Two screenings will be presented dubbed in English, with one in Japanese with English subtitles. All programs are posted online at movingimage.us/winter-recess.

Museum admission (\$15 adults / \$11 seniors and students / \$9 youth ages 3–17) includes a ticket for "A Muppet Family Christmas and More" screening. Families are also welcome to explore exhibitions, including The Jim Henson Exhibition. All programs are free for Museum members at the Film Lover and MoMI Kids Premium levels and above. Dir. Hayao Miyazaki. 2005, 119 mins. DCP. Featuring the voices of Christian Bale, Jean Simmons, Emily Mortimer, Lauren Bacall. Loosely based on Diana Wynn Jones's novel, Studio Ghibli and Hayao Miyazaki created a world filled with witches and curses where a young woman, Sophie, is turned into an old woman by a curse and a castle has legs! Sophie meets Howl, a wizard who is also cursed, and his castle filled with an odd assortment of friends that become family. Together they must try to undo their curses and find self-acceptance.
